Where do I take ESL classes in Northern Alameda County?

We have different types of schools that offer English classes in Northern Alameda County: adult schools and community colleges. Before you choose a class, we recommend that you think about why you are studying English.

Why do I want to

study English?

I don't have a social

security number. Can I take a class?

Adult schools do not ask for a social security number during the registration process.

Community colleges ask for a social security number during

the registration process, but

students are not required to

provide it. Community college

social security number, as you will be considered an international student.

ADULT SCHOOL

I want to study English, and I need to start at the beginning. I need practice with the alphabet and numbers.

Adult schools offer English classes for students at every level. We recommend that you begin at an adult school to build your English skills.

I never finished high school and want to get my GED.

Many adult schools offer classes to prepare you to take (and pass!) the GED exam.

I need to improve my English to communicate in the community, at my child's school, and at my work.

Adult schools offer English classes for students who want to learn basic communication skills. We recommend that you begin at an adult school to build uour English skills.

COSTS OF ADULT SCHOOL

It is typically free to attend an adult school, regardless of your immigration status. There may be a charge for materials. You must be 18 years or older to attend.

COMMUNITY **COLLEGE**

I want a certificate to get a specific job.

You can receive a technical certificate in subjects like mechanics, aviation, computers, business and more at community colleges. We recommend that you have at least an intermediate level of English before starting a certificate program.

I want to transfer to a university and get a college degree.


Manu students take universitu-level courses at a community college to save money before they transfer to a university. We recommend that you meet with an academic counselor to create a plan.

I need to improve specific English skills, like pronunciation or reading and writing.

Community colleges offer classes in many different subjects. You can choose classes based on the specific language areas that you want to improve.

COSTS OF COMMUNITY COLLEGE

The cost to attend community college depends on: the number of classes you take, how long you've lived in California, your family income and your immigration status. The community college and government can help pay for the costs. Please see a financial aid counselor at the community college for more information.
